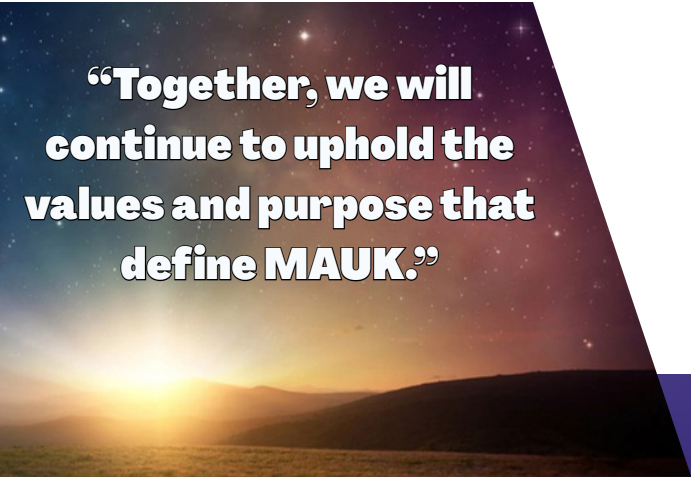

MEMBERSHIP

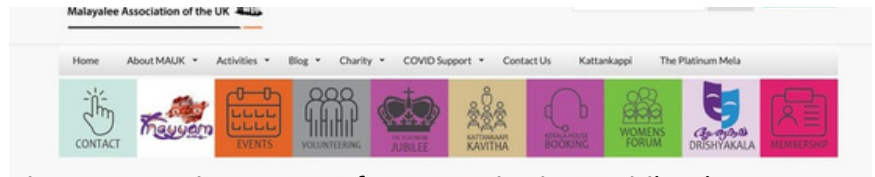
In 2025, we added 72 new family members to our organisation. Membership is completely processed through online mediums. Yearly subscriptions can now be paid by standing order or direct debit.

CHENDA CLASSES

Chenda classes currently take place at Kerala House on Thursday evenings and Sunday mornings, with 30 students across seven classes catering to all ages.

AKSHARA BOOK CLUB

Akshara Book Club launched under the initiative of MAUK WF, meets once every two months to review a selected novel through Zoom, based on the preferences and opinions of its members.

Started with the aim of encouraging reading and promoting literature, the group warmly welcomes everyone to join.

MAUK Launches 'Ezhuthachan Grandhashala' Library

M.A.U.K. has established a new library named Ezhuthachan Grandhashala, with the primary aim of collecting and archiving books authored by Malayalam writers based in the UK.

Further to showcasing works by UK-based authors, the library features a curated selection of Malayalam literature from renowned writers in Kerala, India. Members of MAUK have the opportunity to borrow these books for a nominal rental fee, promoting greater access to Malayalam literary heritage within the community.



BHARATHANATYAM CLASSES

Bharathanatyam classes continue to be delivered weekly, with children's sessions for ages 5–10 and 11–15 held on Sundays at Little Ilford School, alongside adult beginner sessions on Wednesdays and Sundays at Kerala House.

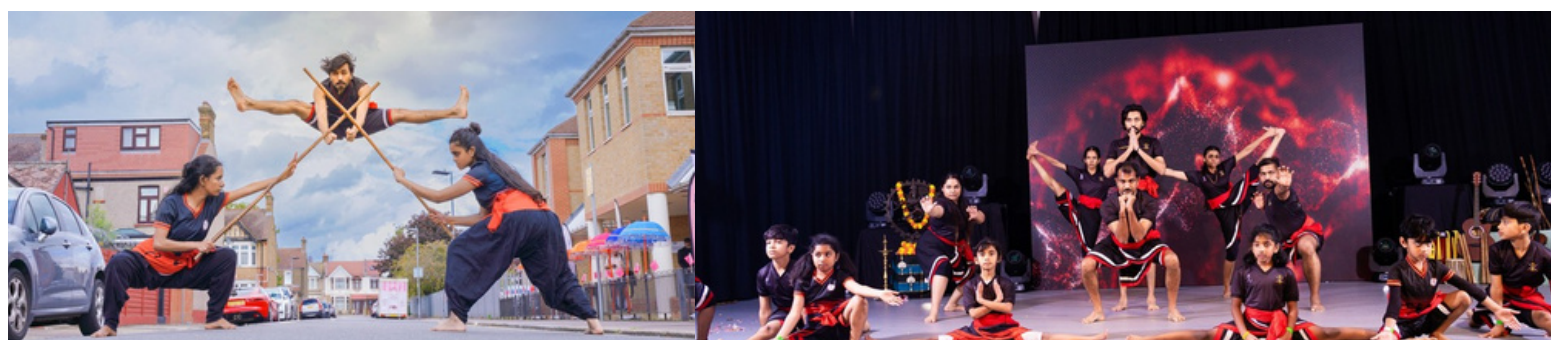
Designed for both beginners and those returning after a break, the programme focuses on developing core adavus (steps), coordination, stamina, and a strong foundation in movement technique and rhythm. Taught in the Kalakshetra style by Ms Jasline Shimmy Antony, the classes currently engage more than 40 students.



KALARI PAYATTU

Kalaripayattu, one of India's oldest martial arts rooted in Kerala, combines fluid movement, strength and discipline to build agility, confidence and inner balance.

Under the guidance of Manu Sunilkumar, we are proud to share that MAUK Kalari classes are progressing exceptionally well, with more than 60 dedicated students actively training and growing in this ancient art form. This strong participation reflects both the community's enthusiasm and the timeless appeal of Kalaripayattu.





At a ceremony held to pay tribute to M. T. Vasudevan Nair, who enriched the Malayalam language with so many writings, many speakers discussed in detail his literary and cultural contributions.

Sujith Bhakthan, a global traveler and vlogger, appeared on the "Kattan Kaappiyum Kavithayum" stage to share his travel experiences. Many expatriate Malayalis had gathered from different places across the country to see him, as thousands follow him online.

The renowned Carnatic musician Dr. Manakkal Gopalakrishnan performed a concert before a full audience at Kerala House and he also introduced Carnatic music to the listeners. He was accompanied by Ratheesh Manoharan on the violin and Prakash Ramachandra on the mridangam. Rajesh Raman served as the host of the program.

In addition to the programs held at Kerala House, many digital conferences were organized where numerous literary works were presented. The discussions were lively. A segment titled "Mathrubhumi Capsule", which presented concise summaries of writings from the Mathrubhumi Weekly, received special attention.

MAUK's Sunday Wellness Mission ran every Sunday from 9 AM to 4 PM at Little Ilford School and Kerala House, offering a full day of activities designed to support community well-being. The programme provided a wide range of free and subsidised sessions suitable for all age groups, creating an inclusive and engaging environment for learning, recreation, and social connection.

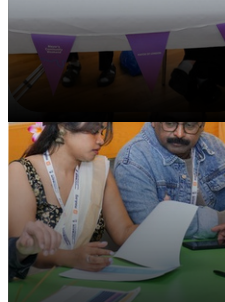
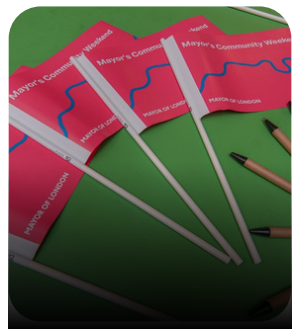




PONNONAM 2025

Onam is the celebration of oneness. Since the early 1970s, M.A.U.K. has been celebrating Onam, the harvest festival of Kerala, in grand splendour every year without fail. The celebration has become a much-revered date in the calendar of the U.K. Malayalees and is one of the largest and most significant social gatherings of Malayalees in the U.K.







MAUK Swayam Ponnonam 2025 marked the grand finale of MAUK's 50th year of registration and was held on Saturday, 13 September 2025, from 3:00 PM onwards at Eastbury Community School, Barking. The event featured Chinganilav: The Onam Musical, which brought the spirit of Onam to life through a vibrant theatrical performance, along with a series of spectacular dance presentations by renowned artists. The celebration also included an unforgettable music concert by the acclaimed Manjari and her team, whose soulful performances captivated the audience. The programme was elegantly presented by Meera Anil, whose charm and energy added to the overall experience. The event stood out as one of the grandest and most memorable community celebrations of the year, bringing together Malayalees for a day filled with cultural splendour, colourful performances, and joyous festivities.



Alongside this, a variety of cultural programmes showcased the incredible talent of M.A.U.K. students and local artists, adding vibrancy to the festivities. The celebration proved to be a truly memorable occasion for all who attended, beautifully blending tradition, culture and artistry.

UNITY FESTIVAL 2025

MAUK hosted the Unity Festival 2025 as part of the London Mayor’s Community Weekend and ahead of its Ponnonam 2025 celebrations, bringing together families and community members for a vibrant celebration of culture, food, music and the spirit of Onam. The festival created a welcoming space for people of all ages and backgrounds to connect, participate and experience traditional Onam festivities in a community setting. Activities included South Indian art-form workshops and demonstrations, a mini Onasadya with refreshments, Onam-themed games and activities, as well as face painting, henna and other interactive stalls. Through shared cultural experiences and community participation, the event reflected MAUK’s commitment to celebrating cultural heritage, strengthening community bonds and promoting inclusion and togetherness.





MAUK's first official awards were introduced and presented during Ponnonam 2025. The M.A.U.K. Awards were established to honour individuals and organisations whose meaningful contributions have created a lasting positive impact on the community.

M.A.U.K.'s Onasadhya 2025 took place on Sunday, 31 August 2025, at Little Ilford School, Manor Park, London E12, with programmes scheduled at 1:00 pm, 2:00 pm and 3:00 pm. The event was a resounding success, continuing a cherished tradition dating back to the mid-1970s.

The meals were prepared by volunteers both at the venue and in their homes under the guidance of M.A.U.K. elders. Staying true to tradition, no food was ordered from restaurants, preserving the authentic spirit of home-cooked delicacies. Celebrated annually by Malayalees in the UK, the event brought together M.A.U.K. members, friends and the wider local community, with over 300 participants gathering to share and enjoy the lovingly prepared Onasadhya dishes.

As part of this long-standing tradition, a proportion of the proceeds from the Onasadhya continued to be donated to a selected charity initiative in Kerala, allowing those supported by the initiative to share an Onasadhya meal at the same time M.A.U.K. volunteers began serving guests at the celebration in London.





The M.A.U.K. Lunch Club, an integral part of M.A.U.K. Elders Services, has been serving the Malayalee community since 1998. This thoughtfully designed initiative offers elders a welcoming space to connect, celebrate cultural heritage, and enjoy communal activities. Participants engage in a wide range of activities, including card and board games, exercise classes, arts and crafts, poetry, film screenings, picnics, and group outings. These are complemented by weekly Kerala-style meals. Supported by Public Health and the London Borough of Newham, the Club also operates as a warm centre, welcoming elders from all local communities.

To sustain this vital service, M.A.U.K. introduced a sponsorship scheme, enabling generous individuals and community-oriented businesses to sponsor a day's operation—whether to honour loved ones, celebrate special occasions, or promote their ventures. In 2025, every Thursday was successfully booked by sponsors for the Lunch Club—a testament to the community's spirit and commitment under the dedicated leadership of Directors R. Sambasivan and Suresh Sukumaran.

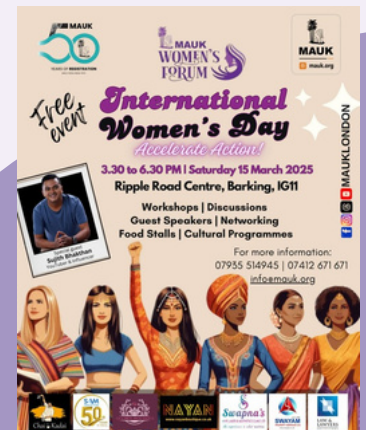

The programme brought families together for a memorable night of music, dining, and shared purpose, reinforcing the importance of connection and collective action in advancing women's empowerment.



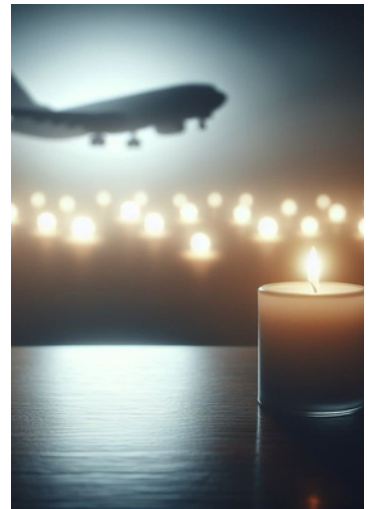
REPUBLIC DAY AND MEMBER'S GATHERING
